6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

#### 6.3.1 Curriculum Development

As the institution is affiliated under Dibrugarh University so the curriculum is developed according to the guidelines of Dibrugarh University. Faculty of the college represent different boards created by the University regarding curriculum. Dibrugarh University introduced semester system from this session for B.A/B.Sc. and the traditional Degree course is also going on. The Study Centre of KKHOU has been providing the courses of B.A, BCA, BBP and BMC. The institution has been offering short term career oriented courses for the degree students.

#### 6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

Apart from the traditional method of teaching the faculty of the college try to use new methodology such as power point presentation, field study, group discussion etc.

Five (05) faculty members successfully submitted their Minor Research Projects under UGC and three faculty members received three new Minor Projects. Students of each department presented seminar papers following research methodology in departmental seminars. The faculty members guided the students to prepare seminar papers by following research mechanics






